







CORONAVIRUS Precautions

Handling Medical Waste From Potentially Infected Patients

- → Use two red liner bags
- → Ensure red bags are closed/tied with an overhand balloon knot to avoid leaking before being moved
- → Place waste into single-use containers only (boxes and sharps containers)
- → Lab waste and sharps waste should be overpacked in bags and also placed in single-use containers
- → Label containers as "Special Handling"
- → Notify BWS immediately if any waste meets criteria







Help prevent the spread of highly contagious viruses

- Wash hands often with soap & water for at least 20 seconds
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, & mouth with unwashed hands
- Stay home when you are sick
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue
- Disinfect frequently touched objects & surfaces
